

## Age Eligibility

CSPP Age Eligibility for the 2020-2021 school year:

children with birth dates between September 2, 2015, and December 1, 2017

children, who turn 3 on or after December 2, 2017, maybe enrolled in CSPP on or after their 3rd birthday

\*Excludes children who are age-eligible for Transitional Kindergarten

(children who turn 5 between September 2nd and December 2nd)

CSPP Age Eligibility for the 2021-2022 school year: 3 & 4-year-olds

children who turn 3 years old on or before December 1, maybe enrolled.

children, who turn 3 on or after December 2, maybe enrolled in CSPP, after their 3rd birthday.

children who are 4 years old.

\*Excludes children who are age-eligible for Transitional Kindergarten

(children who turn 5 between September 2nd and December 2nd)

## Order of Priority:

First priority are age eligible 3- and 4-year-old children who are recipients of child protective services or who have been determined to be at risk of neglect, abuse, or exploitation.

Second priority are age eligible 4-year-old children who are returning for a second year in the program and then 4-year-old children, in accordance to family income ranking, with the lowest family income rankings being admitted first.

Third priority are age eligible 3-year-old children, in accordance to family income ranking, with the lowest family income rankings being admitted first.

If space is available after all eligible children listed above are enrolled, the following children may be enrolled in this order:

age eligible 3- and 4-year-old children from families whose income is no more than 15 percent above the eligibility income threshold (limited to 10 percent of all enrolled children);

age eligible 3- and 4-year-old children with exceptional needs without regard to a family's income, with age eligible 4-year-old children having the priority ahead of age eligible 3-year-old children in this group; and

age eligible 4-year old children whose families reside within the attendance boundary of a qualifying Free and Reduced Price Meal Program (FRPMP) elementary school without regard to a family's income. A qualified FRPMP elementary school is a public school where at least 80 percent of the enrolled students are eligible for the Free and Reduced Price Meal Program.

An eligibility ranking list will be maintained throughout the year to ensure enrollment according to State admission priorities.
