



Types of Financial Aid

Scholarships: aid provided to support a student's education, awarded on the basis of academic or other achievement.

Grants: a sum of money given by a government or other organization for a particular purpose.

Work-Study: part-time jobs for undergraduate and graduate students with financial need, allowing them to earn money to help pay education.

Loans: a sum of money that when lent, is expected to be **paid back with interest.**

Grades get you paid

- In California your 10th -11th grade grades help you qualify for special grants.
- Cal Grant A requires a minimum 3.0 GPA. Cal Grant B requires a minimum 2.0 GPA.
